

Guilt Ruled In Draft Balk

Probation Term Given Witnesses

A 25-year-old Jehovah's Witness from Bellevue, Wash., after being found guilty of violating the draft laws, was placed on three years' probation Wednesday on condition he spend two of those years doing hospital work.

Chief U.S. District Court Judge Geo. J. Solomon ruled Oct. 18 that David Vincent Cathcart's claim to be a minister for the Jehovah's Witnesses did not exempt him from a charge of violating the draft laws.

In ordering him to report for hospital work as a condition of his probation, Solomon admonished Cathcart not to do any preaching to the patients during his working hours. "After you are through working," Solomon said, "you can do any kind of ministerial work you want to take on."

Model-Building Portland Teen Gives \$60,000 Gemini Prize To OMSI

Oregon's Museum of Science and Industry Wednesday presented the only Gemini capsule of its kind — thanks to Robbie Alan Hanshaw, 13, and the Revell and McDonnell-Douglas Corp.

Robbie, a model builder since the age of 4, won the 3,500-pound authentic model of a Gemini two-man space capsule in a worldwide model contest.

The full-size capsule, 19 feet long and 8 feet in diameter, wouldn't fit in Robbie's living room. So he gave it to his father's "charity" with proper ceremony, in front of OMSI, to the cheers of 40 classmates and the student council from Dale Ickes school.

"Robbie has been fascinated by OMSI ever since his first visit," his father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. Robert A. Hanshaw of Hill St. Hillsboro, said.

In appreciation for the gift of the \$60,000 metal capsule, Loren McKinley, OMSI director, gave Robbie a life membership.

The exhibit, donated to the contest jointly by Lewis H. Glasser, president of Revell

and by the McDonnell-Douglas Corp., is the only model built by McDonnell exactly scaled and authentic in every detail, except for a few classified instruments in the cockpit, McDonnell engineers say.

OMSI inherited Robbie's prize along with his prize. The Gemini is too big for the museum. Museum crews will either have to rip off the roof to make way for the space capsule or house it on the patio in the rear of the museum.

The capsule is weather proof. The authentic cockpit, just like the ones in which 20 U. S. astronauts have orbited the earth for real, can be viewed but not entered.

Robbie won the grand sweepstakes prize in competition with more than 300,000 other entries in Revell's lifetime national contest, President Glasser explained.

He also won one each of the 200 different model kits the company puts out.

"There was just barely room for me when I got all the kits stacked in my room," Robbie said.

Suspects Deny Bank Robbery

Two of the three men charged with the armed robbery of the Scappoose Branch of the Bank of St. Helens pleaded innocent when arraigned on the charges in U.S. District Court Wednesday.

Entering pleas of innocent were Douglas George Moccie, 18, Seattle, and Edwin W. Houthens, 27, of 3316 SE Francis St. The third suspect, Danny Joe Eastman, 19, Bt. 1, is expected to be arraigned next week.

According to the federal grand jury indictment, the trio is charged with taking \$12,785 during the holdup at the bank. All three were taken into custody the day of the holdup and most of the money was recovered.

Portland Chamber Backs Metropolitan Rule

Announcing support Wednesday creation of a metropolitan form of government, the Portland Chamber of Commerce reaffirmed its support for House Bill 1192.

HB 1192, which was approved by the House but died in the Senate at the last session of the Legislature, permits cities to merge and annex new territory if a majority of voters in the larger city and a majority of voters in incorporated or unincorporated areas near the city vote for the merger plan.

At present law, if one city or voting area rejects the design, whole merger plan is dead.

While the bill was designed specifically for the Portland area, it would aid other Oregon cities which want to merge, Robert W. Packwood, (R-Portland), chairman of the House Local Government Committee, said during hearings on the bill in February.

Asked by the session to chair support of metropolitan government, Portland Mayor Dan Schunk said: "The sooner the better. It's just silly to have this multitude of special service districts that we have now."

Rivergate Area Cited

Using the Rivergate Industrial District (operated by the state's Port of Portland Commission) as an example, the mayor said:

"It is inconceivable to me that with the need for sewers, fire protection and water out there, that was not come into the city."

Asked to comment on whether he would be willing to see the city government absorbed into a metropolitan government, Schunk said:

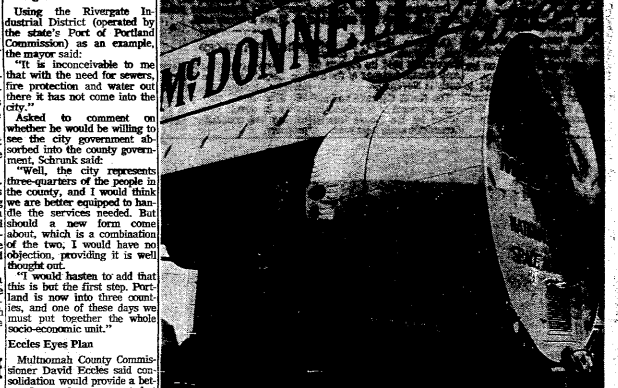
"Well, the city represents the best of the people in the country, and I would think we are better equipped to handle the services needed. But should a new form come about, which is a combination of the two, I would have no objection, providing it is well thought out."

"I would hasten to add that this is not the first step. Portland is now into three counties, and one of these days we must put together the whole socio-economic unit."

Metropolitan County Commissioner David Eccles said consolidation would provide a better form of government but would not solve the problems which overlap into other counties.
